

Transcripts	Upon completion of the semester/year, the student fills out an Application for a Transcript of Records, once all grades have been posted online. The International Office then issues an official transcript and sends it to the home university.	
Number of credits	Undergraduate and graduate students are usually enrolled in 24-30 credits per semester; deviations are possible

German and/or English: minimum level B1 Usually, B1 competences are not sufficient to follow high level academic courses, esp. in the Humanities Language requirement (e.g. Students can visit academic courses in English, while also visiting TOEFL/IELTS/others) language courses for German as a Foreign Language offered by the Language Institute. Students who apply for and pay the deposit in time are usually guaranteed accommodation in 'Seezeit' Student Housing.

The application form and details on the housing deposit are included in the <u>information</u> provided on the International Office homepage. Please note: it is crucial that the housing deposit arrives in Konstanz by the deadline.

Accommodation

Unfortunately, there is no assistance; finding private housing in Konstanz also is very difficult and expensive. Good websites to look for accommodation are www.vierwaen.de, www.wg-gesucht.de, www.wg-gesucht.de, www.studenten-wg.de. You can find offers from private landlords in the local daily newspaper Suedkurier: www.suedkurier.de Private housing is best found when on-site; bring time and patience.

Please be aware of scams – ads written in English, passport copies of landlord sent, money to be sent via Western Union.

Estimated expenses per month (in local currency)

Accommodation: 260-380 Euros per month in Dormitories

Food: 120-250 Euros/month

Local transportation: semester student pass 48 Euros

	Printing (50-100/sem), insurance (80/mon), campus fees (80/sem) Personal: 150-450 Euros/month (depends on individual habits, of course: travelling, partying, choosing expensive foods in the cafeteria) Important: In the first 2 months students will need more money than in the following months to cover all initial costs. Students should prepare accordingly.
Visa requirements	Visa: Citizens from EU/EEA countries and Switzerland, the US, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Korea, Israel and Brazil do not need a visa to enter Germany. All others NEED a student visa (NOT a tourist visa) that students have to apply for ahead of time. Residence Permit: ALL students (except from EU/EEA countries and Switzerland) will apply for a residence permit ("Aufenthaltstitel") in Konstanz upon arrival. The IO will assist.
Medical insurance	Students from the EU/EEA and Switzerland are automatically insured through their EHIC card. Students with non-EU/EEA nationality <u>are required</u> to enroll in German health Insurance; the IO will assist with this upon arrival.
